Sports Premium information

Rationale

After analysing the spending of the 2015/2016 Sports Premium Grant and extra-curricular sports club data, it is evident that boys' attendance at these sports clubs outweighs girls' attendance.

In 2015/2016, we entered over 20 competitive school games tournaments; the majority of these teams consisted of all boys (excluding girls' football, sports hall athletics, tag rugby and kwik cricket).

In order to address this, through the academic year, 2016/2017, the sports premium grant will prioritise increasing girl's participation in extra-curricular clubs, school fixtures and competitive school games tournaments. It will also be spent on continuing to upgrade P.E equipment and coaching certificates for staff so that we can continue to provide a broad range of school sports and take part with a level of confidence in competitive school games competitions.

Continuing to organise a school health and wellbeing week and sports day must remain a school focus; it includes all learners and promotes the importance of a health way of life in a non-competitive way.

2016/2017 Priority:

To increase the participation of girls in extra-curricular sports clubs, Intra-school fixtures and competitive school games tournaments.

Continued actions:

- To continue affiliation with school games competitions to attend as many tournaments as possible for KS1 and KS2
- To continue provision of PE and Clubs equipment Audit every term and upgrade/purchase as necessary.
