Sports Premium information

The sports premium is additional sports funding to address improvements to the provision of PE and sport. Our focus is upon healthy lifestyle and increasing participation in sports.

Sports premium is paid direct to school, allocated to the PE co-ordinator and to decide how to use the funding, as they are best placed to assess what additional sports provision their pupils need.

Academies and free school must publish on their website information about their use of the premium. Schools should publish the amount of premium received; how it has been spent (or will be spent) and what impact it has had on the pupils. =
