- ⇒ Trust the school to care for your child. We have a thorough procedure in place to keep children and staff safe.
- \Rightarrow Ensure all entrances are clear to allow for emergency services arrival if required.
- ⇒ Keep your contact details, especially mobile numbers, up to date. We will keep you informed via our text messaging service.
