



## Helping Your Child to Read!

- Find a time that's good for both of you maybe before bed, after tea. Make it your special time with your child.
- Make it fun -talk about what they have read, joke about the characters, have similar things happened to you?
- Try to be patient. It can be frustrating, but children learn more quickly and easily if it's fun, so if it's getting stressful, leave it and come back later!
- Let your child puzzle over words they are more likely to remember something next time if they've worked it out themselves.
- Most children love hearing stories, and it really helps them to learn to read themselves. So, try to read to your child regularly.
- Children often make a lot of errors, but don't correct every mistake. If you correct everything, they won't remember it all!
- Let your child have a good look at the pictures before they read; they are attractive, fun and provide a lot of information, especially when they are just beginning to read.
- Don't keep interrupting! It will confuse a child, they will forget what they have read, and so it won't make sense to them.
- Praise them! Learning to read can be hard work and every genuine effort deserves a big 'Well Done'!
