# Croyland Primary School: PE and Sports Funding January 2021 – April 2022

### Rationale for SPG spending from January 2021–July 2022 (Extended time period due to Covid

Our focus for the year ahead is to ensure legacy and longevity to any spending carried out.

The importance of physical activity and leading a healthy lifestyle has never been more important for our pupils. Consequently, our SPG will be used to improve the physical opportunities that our pupils have throughout the school. Good physical health is vitally important to maintain and improve the mental wellbeing of society. To ensure our pupils are motivated to have good physical health, the SPG will be used to purchase new playground markings and equipment for pupils in every year group of the school. In addition to this also, a purpose built MUGA (Multi-Use Games Area). A MUGA is an outdoor PE facility that can be used for break times, PE curriculum lessons and after-school sports clubs.

The SPG will be used to ensure our pupils' gain important and vital life skills within cycling and swimming. It is our aim to ensure, as many Year 6 pupils leave us achieving Bikeability level 1 and 2, so that they can ride their bikes safely, with independence, street awareness and confidence before starting secondary school. Access for all KS2 pupils to swimming, every year remains a school priority.

Given the context of our school and knowing our pupils well, the SPG will also be used to prioritise and enable pupil premium entitled pupils to access sporting experiences. This will be achieved through inclusion in after-school sports clubs and by exposing them to as many competitive sport and enrichment opportunities as possible. School has a pivotal role to play in pupils' experiences of sport and physical activity and the grant will be used to ensure that all pupils have the opportunity to take part in a wide range of high quality extra-curricular clubs that are led by trained staff.

Our teaching will continue to be supported by two planning portals. Teachers will use the iMoves planning portal to plan and inform their teaching. Teachers have noted that they are confident with this planning portal and continue to use this to good effect.

The SPG will allow us to continue to professionally develop our teachers in KS2. This will be achieved by teachers observing sports specific PE lessons that are delivered by Northants County Cricket (NCCC) and Saints Rugby initiatives. This will enables teachers to increase their game knowledge, skills and understanding and enhance their teacher bank of resources, ideas and strategies to teach KS2 games lessons. At Croyland, playtimes can be challenging for some of our pupils. This will be addressed by using the SPG to train lunchtime supervisors to provide opportunities for pupils to learn to play positively with each other from an early age.

The SPG will also be used to further improve the amount of activity resources that are available to our pupils each day. The SPG will be used to purchase additional outdoor exercise equipment to supplement our existing equipment. We have listened to our pupils and observed the impact that previously installed equipment has had upon physical activity levels and whole school behaviour. We also believe that this equipment will provide a legacy for the SPG grant as future year groups will be using the equipment in the coming years.

# 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick starting healthy lifestyles

Every week, each class takes part in 2 hours of PE. One session takes place inside and the other outside. In EYFS and KS1 pupils are challenged to develop their fundamental skills such as agility, balance and co-ordination. In contrast, KS2 pupils are offered a wide range of modified sports. All teachers are assisted in the planning of PE with the iMoves programme. This is paid for yearly through the SPG and offers teachers schemes of work, lesson plans and resources for the teaching of high quality PE, dance and gymnastics.

# 2. The profile of PE and Sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

Teachers acknowledge that all pupils in classes now remember PE kit and there is less non-participation in PE classes. Recently acquired outdoor fitness equipment has seen an increase in the motivation for pupils to lead active lifestyles. Maeve Wildman continues to lead a variety of after-school clubs for all key stages. These clubs have been well attended and Maeve continues to be a positive role model for all of our pupils taking part in **school clubs**.

#### Spring 2022 (January to February)

The current Year 6 cohort missed their swimming lessons in Year 4 as a result of pool closures and had a reduced lesson time (30 minutes rather than 45 minutes) in Year 5 as a result of additional precautions being in place in line with Government guidance. At the end of Year 5 (Summer 21), the minority (48%) of the cohort achieved swimming the expected 25m. In response to this, to give our children the best opportunity and provision to achieve their 25m or develop their confidence further, Year 6 pupils continued their swimming lessons in the Spring term 22 for half a term. At end of this additional block of swimming lessons the pupils were reassessed. We now know that the majority (63%) of pupils have now achieved swimming 25m or above. In addition to this, 28% of the cohort have achieved beyond the expected distance. There are now 22 pupils (37%) who have not met the expected distance, however of those 22 pupils, 6 were absent for the assessment and 10 pupils have made progress from their Year 5 distance. In the Summer term, those pupils who did not reach the expected distance will be reviewed. It is important to report that pupil's confidence has significantly increased. Pupils who achieved 25m in Y5 and again in Y6 have shown they are more confident in achieving the distance.

# 3. Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport

At Croyland, we are fortunate to have a number of staff who lead active lifestyles. Many staff members pursue active lifestyles and many others specialise in specific sports such as Netball, Football, Cycling, Golf, Swimming, Dance and Running. Teachers with enthusiasm for sport, often offer advice for teachers who are less confident in this subject area. As a school we plan for PE using the iMoves programme. Teachers have stated that this programme has given them more confidence when planning and teaching a unit in PE. We are beginning to identify outdoor PE in KS2 as an area to develop and we are currently in the formative stages of developing a plan to help our teachers improve their practices.

# 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.

Extra-curricular sports clubs continue to be a focus for the school. Pupils in all key stages are offered the opportunity to take part in free sports sessions before and after school. In the last year, we have seen a positive rise in the amount of Pupil Premium pupils who are accessing sports clubs. Club analysis has shown that most clubs registers have higher than 50% PP pupils. Pupils are able to voice opinions about future sports clubs and where possible staff are able to provide an opportunity for pupils. In addition to this, we have seen a rise in the number of SEND pupils who are accessing after-school clubs.
